



#### **GREAT SILK ROAD**


The history of silkworm breeding in Uzbekistan goes deep to many centuries back. "Great Silk Road", a trade channel from China to Europe, passing through all Asian countries, played a big role in development of silkworm breeding & silk weaving in Central Asian countries, especially in Uzbekistan.





### HISTORY OF SILKWORM BREEDING IN UZBEKISTAN

Research activities of the Institute of Archaeology of the Academy of Science witness the existence of silkworm breeding & silk weaving in the territory of Uzbekistan 4000 years ago – in Ferghana valley, on the springs of Zaravshan river, also in the south of Uzbekistan.

### JOINT VENTURES IN THE SILK INDUSTRY


- 1. Uzbek-China JV "Hvashen Bukhara Co. Ltd." (filoselle threads)

### Share of world production of silkworm cocoons


Uzbekistan is the third world producer of cocoons after China and India. And Uzbekistan is the first world producer of cocoons on per capita basis. Today Uzbekistan's share in total productions of cocoons throughout CIS countries exceeds 80 percent.





#### Dynamics of export production of the «Uzbek silk» Association

In 2004 the export growth reached - 35,6% In 2005 export is scheduled to increase by - 14,5%






#### The types of export production


The exports of silk is growing annually. If in 1998 the exports totaled US\$ 0,64 mln., then by 2004 this index reached US\$ 16,27 mln.

The main importers of the silk production are the countries like China, India, Japan, Vietnam, Korea, Turkey and others.





### Dynamics of attraction of foreign investments





#### Attraction of the field among foreign investors

- Steady sources of raw materials;
- Low costs for energy resources;
- Inexpensive but highly qualified labor resources;
- Profound knowledge and traditions of growing the silk cocoons;
- Specific design of finished silk clothes in Uzbekistan;
- Substantial market for finished goods;
- Favorable investment climate and preferential regime for foreign investors.

### Prospects of silk industry of Uzbekistan (2006-2010)

The 16 investment projects are envisaged to be implemented within the Investment Program of the «Uzbek Ipagi» Association through foreign direct investments amounting at about US\$ 20 mln.

Implementation of this program can provide:

-manufacture of silkworm - 12000 boxes

-manufacture of raw silk threads - 1050 tons

-manufacture of clothes – 3521 000. m.

-manufacture of finished products – 300 000. units

-jobs – about 4000 persons.







At present silk is an integral part of textile industry and as silk threads are added to cotton yarn, we can get a unique by its structure and design composition of material, which is used in manufacturing the finished clothes, scarf, ties, shirts and others.
